Summary of Proposed Bylaw Change

Establish a standing bylaws committee.

What Section(s) Does the Bylaws Change Involve?

- Section IX - Bylaw Amendments

Detailed Reason for Change(s)

State Central Committee meetings often go on for very long extended periods of time causing great frustration for large portions of the participants in the room, often times to the point of becoming counterproductive. Many times, it's as a result of an excessive amount of amendments introduced from the floor of the body. Many of these amendments could be avoided by having a second set of eyes, like a committee, assist in editing drafts to the proposed bylaws to help ensure they are ready for primetime before moving to the body as a whole. The committee would also help weed out and/or combine duplicate proposals. It would also give the committee the ability to pass proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions to the body with their recommendation for passage. It would also give the committee the ability to kill proposed bylaw amendments or resolutions that may be duplicates or haven't been as well thought out yet, however, even if the bylaws committee would decide to kill a proposed bylaw or resolution it could still be placed on the agenda at the next State Central Committee meeting by a reasonably achievable threshold of a one-third vote. Also, if the committee can't come to a consensus on a proposed bylaw or resolution it gives the committee the ability to send it to the body with no recommendation where it would only need one-fifth of the body to place it on the calendar. It also lays out the makeup of the committee in the same fashion as it's currently made up - by appointments by the Chair and the Regional Directors and when proposals need to be submitted by. This would also ensure that all proposals don't end up sitting on the sidelines for years and ensure they are all given a hearing.

Proposed New or Revised Content

A bylaw amendment to establish a standing bylaws committee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SOUTH DAKOTA REPUBLICAN PARTY:

Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added to Section IX:

3. **Bylaws Committee:** A standing Bylaw Committee shall be established.
The duties of the Bylaws Committee shall consist of:

- (1) Review, and amend if needed, all proposed amendments to the South Dakota Republican Party Bylaws and resolutions, coordinate amendments with the prime sponsor to ensure that the final wording is consistent with the intentions of the prime sponsor.
- (2) Make a recommendation of "Pass", "Do Not Pass", or "No Recommendation" of each proposed bylaw or resolution.
- (3) Ensure proposed bylaws comply with state laws, federal laws, and Republican National Committee bylaws.
- (4) The committee shall operate continuously and meet at the call of the chair to review, and edit if needed, proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions.

Bylaw Committee recommendations - Final disposition:

- (1) Do Pass - A proposed bylaw amendment or resolution receiving a "Do Pass" recommendation from the committee shall be placed on the agenda for the next regular or special meeting.
- (2) Do Not Pass - A proposed bylaw amendment or resolution receiving a "Do Not Pass" recommendation from the committee shall be considered killed and not placed on the agenda for any future regular or special State Central Committee meetings.

A proposed bylaw amendment or resolution killed by receiving a "Do Not Pass" recommendation from the committee shall be placed on the agenda only if a calendaring motion receives a vote of one-third of the members present at the next regular or special State Central Committee meeting.

- (3) No Recommendation - A proposed bylaw amendment or resolution receiving "No Recommendation" from the committee shall be placed on the agenda only if a calendaring motion receives a vote of one-fifth of the members present at the next regular or special State Central Committee meeting.

Bylaws Amendment Submission (continued)

(4) Final disposition on a proposed bylaw amendment or resolution requires a majority vote of the members present taken by roll call.

Proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions shall be submitted in accordance with Section IX, §1, not less than fifteen days prior to the meeting in which it shall be considered.

All Bylaw Committee Members are voting members, and the committee shall be made up of:

(1) The Chair of the Bylaws Committee shall be appointed by the Chair of the South Dakota Republican Party.

(2) The Members of the Bylaws Committee shall be appointed by the six Regional Directors. One member from each region appointed by their respective Regional Director.

(3) Bylaw committee members must be a member of a County Central Committee.

(4) Bylaw committee members serve for a term of three years.

(5) Chair vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Chair of the South Dakota Republican Party. Member vacancies shall be filled by appointment of the respective Regional Directors in which the vacancy occurs.
